# Dr Shaikh Mehdee Mohammad - PhD in Geography, 2015

Dr. Shaikh has recently been involved in providing food assistance to the vulnerable and unemployed members of society in Bangladesh with a group of fellow alumni from the class of 1994 at Harimohan Government High School in Chapai Nawabganj. The group have worked to provide food packs to 135 vulnerable families with these packs including rice, potato, lentils, soybean oil, onions, salt, soap and BDT100 in cash.

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#### Sarah Graham - BSc Adult Nursing, 2012; PG Dip Midwifery, 2015; MSc Practice Development, 2018

Sarah is a dual-trained Nurse and Midwife currently working in an Early Pregnancy Unit supporting women through pregnancy complications prior to 16 weeks. She is being redeployed to A&E over the next week to support colleagues on the front line. Women accessing the service are often experiencing problems such as miscarriage and ectopic pregnancy so are already incredibly vulnerable. She is finding ways to navigate these scary times without compromising on the care provided.

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## Dan Simmonite - BA (Hons) Media & Journalism, 2019

Dan works as the Media Officer at York City Football Club. It's been a very hard period for all professional football clubs, but the club has contributed where they can to bring some positive stories to the York community. Last month when a home game was called off due to COVID-19, the club donated food prepared for match hospitality. Dan worked with the Club Chef to deliver the food Changing Lives, a local charity which houses vulnerable people in York.

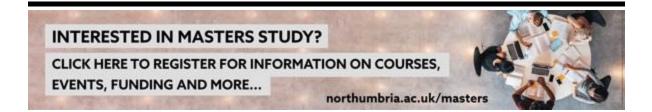
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#### Let's celebrate our alumni community!
