North East universities awarded £8.9m to boost regional research commercialisation

A new project to strengthen collaboration between universities, businesses, and others to drive growth and create jobs in North East England has received major funding from the UK Government. The North East Strategic Commercialisation project, a five-year programme involving Durham, Newcastle, Northumbria, Sunderland and Teesside universities as well as other partners, has been awarded £8.9 million from Research England. It builds on the foundations of the Northern Accelerator spin-out programme.

Academy of Medical Sciences funds new research from emerging scientific leaders

Two biomedical sciences researchers from Northumbria University have been awarded grants to further their innovative work by the Academy of Medical Sciences. Study identifies attitudes towards personal data processing for national security

Almost 80 per cent of UK adults support national security agencies collecting and processing personal data to investigate terrorism and serious crime, according to new research by the Centre for Emerging Technology and Security (CETaS) at The Alan Turing Institute, in collaboration with Savanta and Hopkins Van Mil. Professor Marion Oswald MBE from Northumbria Law School, is a Senior Visiting Fellow at the Centre for Emerging Technology and Security (CETaS) and was a co-author on this study.

Satellites observe glacier committing 'ice piracy'

A glacier in Antarctica is committing 'ice piracy', stealing ice from a neighbour, in a phenomenon that has never been observed in such a short time frame, say scientists. This activity was previously believed to take place over hundreds or even thousands of years, but high-resolution satellite observations have revealed that one huge glacier has been relentlessly stealing ice from its slower-moving neighbour over a 17-year period. The research team included experts from the UK Centre for Polar Observation and Modelling based at Northumbria.


