

Student Specific Internship Scheme

University funding can part-fund (75%) an eligible business to employ a Northumbria student for up to 130 hours. These hours can be used over a period up to 30 June 2021, as agreed between the intern, the University and the employer. This funding can be accessed by small and medium sized employers and larger organisations, including those in the public sector. We are keen to secure internships for students on Psychology and Film and TV Production programmes to increase the employability of students with little or no work experience.
