



Northumbria supports national pledge to protect academic standards

Northumbria University is backing a new national scheme to protect the integrity of university level qualifications. The University has signed up to the Quality Assurance Agency for Higher Education's (QAA) Academic Integrity Charter, which safeguards the standards of university level qualifications. The Charter has been signed by 118 higher education providers across the UK and was developed with the support of the UK Academic Integrity Advisory Group.
