Northumbria University's Business Clinic hits key milestones

A business support programme has achieved a hat-trick of significant milestones as it extends its services across the region and beyond. The Business Clinic has now assisted more than 600 organisations with its free consultancy service, which has benefited multinationals, small-to-medium-sized enterprises (SMEs), social enterprises, not-for-profit organisations and charities. The economic and social value of this assistance has now topped the £3.3m mark, while 2,400 Business School students have worked on consultancy projects since its launch in 2013.

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New appointment makes Professor a central figure in UK air quality research

A researcher at Northumbria University has become a regional lynchpin in the UK's efforts towards achieving better air quality. Professor Anil Namdeo, Professor of Air Quality Management in the Department of Geography and Environmental Sciences, has been appointed by the UK Research and Innovation (UKRI) SPF Clean Air Champions Team as its Regional Clean Air Champion (RCAC) for an area from the East Midlands to the North East of England.


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Northumbria celebrates its diverse and multicultural community

Northumbria graduate modernises food bank supply chain with new platform

Marketing Management graduate, Robin Ferris, launched Bankuet, a highly sustainable and innovative organisation, in 2019. The organisation has modernised the food bank supply chain by delivering only what food banks request at a time they need it. Bankuet has now raised over £2m through its platform, which has gone to feed hungry people in the UK and established itself as the number one supplier to food banks in the UK. More recently, Banquet teamed up with the Northumbria Students' Union food bank to ensure students have access to food parcels.
