To you, it might only be the cost of a cup of coffee but collectively, donations from alumni to our hardship fund of as little as £3, are making a significant difference to Northumbria's most vulnerable students.

Students from disadvantaged backgrounds are more likely to drop-out of university and are less able to call on family for financial support. Currently across the UK, 300,000* are in financial crisis and it is estimated that half are at risk of dropping out. Students' cost of living has increased by 14% but Government funding has only increased by 2.3%**.

Fola couldn't call on family for financial support. When extra hours at work started to undermine his studies, he wondered if it would be better to give up his degree and get a full-time job. Help from Northumbria alumni kept him studying.

"Thank you so much. This will help massively. It will help me to do fewer working hours and free up extra time to study again."

We're supporting as many students as we can with our hardship fund. But with a 69% increase in requests for financial assistance and a 30% rise in students accessing our foodbank, our hardship fund is struggling to keep up. That's why, last month, our student caller team helped raise over £16,000 for our hardship fund - and we are asking for your help too.


