OBE for end-of-life care expert

One of the world's most prominent leaders in end-of-life care and experiences has been awarded an OBE in the King's Birthday Honours List. Professor Allan Kellehear has been appointed Officer, Order of the British Empire (OBE) for services to palliative care. As Professor of End-of-Life Care in Northumbria University's Department of Social Work, Education and Community Wellbeing, Allan's work focuses on enhancing palliative care practices for the dying, their caregivers and the bereaved through a community approach.
