Major funding awards from the UK Space Agency and global aerospace giant, Lockheed Martin has been match-funded by the University to create the North East Space Skills and Technology Centre (NESST). This important Centre will be a "game-changer" for the UK space economy.




The Late John Connelly Award winner announced

Join the Study UK Preparing for Work MOOC


