Lockheed Martin join forces with Northumbria to unlock the future of space-based solar power

As part of British Science Week, Lockheed Martin has announced an investment of £150,000 to Northumbria University in a project that aims to accelerate the delivery of space-based solar power. Combining science and technology, the project will use specialised photovoltaic cells that will collect and convert laser power into useable power for future space and lunar vehicles. This technology has future applications that could include space-based solar power to deliver a consistent source of clean energy.

Research shows the current diversity of tree species has been shaped by climate change

A new global survey of 1,000 forest areas shows how past climate change has had a major impact on the diversity and distribution of the tree species we see today. The results can help to predict how ecosystems will react to future changes, helping to shape conservation management around the globe. A research team from more than 50 research institutes around the world including Northumbria University, has assessed how past climate changes have affected the composition of tree species.

Research funding gives hope for sight loss breakthrough

A team of scientists led by a Northumbria University academic has won funding to research an eye disease suffered by over 190 million people worldwide. The award, from the Academy of Medical Sciences' Springboard Scheme, will help fund ground-breaking techniques to study age-related macular degeneration (AMD), a common disease that affects vision, particularly in elderly people. It is believed that the research, led by Dr Gerrit Hilgen, has the potential to lead to new treatments for AMD.

Study will examine whether popular podcast can influence research culture

A podcast which shares regular insights into the trailblazing research and teaching at Northumbria University's School of Design is now the subject of a study aimed at uncovering the potential impact on research culture. Led by Senior Research Assistants Helen Simmons and Dr Nkumbu Mutambo, the Designamite podcast was launched last summer as a way of helping to highlight the people and projects driving creativity and innovation across all activities within the School of Design at Northumbria.

Polar ice sheet melting records have toppled during the past decade

The seven worst years for polar ice sheets melting and losing ice have occurred during the past decade, according to new research, with 2019 being the worst year on record. NASA and the European Space Agency awarded funding to the Ice Sheet Mass Balance Intercomparison Exercise (IMBIE), which is led by Northumbria University's Centre for Polar Observations and Modelling, in 2011 to compile 50 satellite surveys of Antarctica and Greenland to determine their rate of polar ice sheet melting.


