

WiFi at Northumbria – How to connect using your Smartphone

While on campus you can connect to the NU Simply Web wireless network on your Smartphone. The following is a general guide to the settings that you will need to be able to connect to this network.

Android

- 1 Navigate to your Wi-Fi Settings and select NU Simply Web
- 2 You may be asked to select some/or all of the following settings:

| Security | 802.1 x Enterprise |
|--------------------------------------|--------------------------------|
| Security settings for authentication | (EAP Method) = PEAP |
| Phase 2 Authentication | MSCHAPV2 |
| CA Certificate | Select Do not Validate |
| User Certificate | To be left blank (unspecified) |
| Identity | Your Northumbria username |
| Anonymous Identity | To be left blank |
| Password | Your Northumbria password |

- **3** To finish the configuration press **Connect**
- 4 You will then be connected to the NU Simply Web WiFi Network.

Apple iOS

iOS devices tend to connect with just your username and password. If, however, you receive any certificate errors, please follow these steps:

- 1 Go to the Home screen and tap Settings > WiFi
- 2 If your Wi-Fi is not already enabled (it says Wi-Fi Off at the top of the page), then slide it to the right to switch it to **On**
- 3 Your device should now scan for networks and show you those that it finds. You need to select the one called **NU Simply Web** and then enter your Northumbria username and password when prompted. (Both your Username and Password are case sensitive)
- 4 Tap Join. After a second or so the certificate screen will appear, tap Accept
- 5 Now return to the **Home** screen and then tap **Safari** to browse.

Troubleshooting Tip:

If you've connected to Simply Web before but it won't connect this time, tap on **NU Simply Web** and then select Forget this Network.

Select **NU Simply Web** from the list of available networks again and it will prompt you for your Northumbria Username and Password. Enter these details and you'll be able to access.
