Assistive Software

There is a range of assistive software packages that are available around campus. These are available to all Northumbria University students. However, as Northumbria does not operate a "roaming profiles" policy on their IT network, any customisation or settings changed within the programmes are lost once the user logs out.

Text Help Read & Write (site license)

Available on all open access PC labs but may not be available on faculty/course specific labs.

Mind Genius (site license)

Available on all open access PC labs but may not be available on faculty/course specific labs.

JAWS (5 user concurrent use license)

Available on all open access PC labs but may not be available on faculty/course specific labs. This software has a 5 user license meaning only 5 students can be using this concurrently.

ZoomText (5 user concurrent use license)

Available on all open access PC labs but may not be available on faculty/course specific labs. This software has a 5 user license meaning only 5 students can be using this concurrently.

Simply Web

Loan Equipment

The Disability and Dyslexia Support Team has a range of equipment available for disabled students to borrow. The loan bank consists of approximately 60 HP laptops and 80 Olympus Digital Voice Recorders which are loaned to disabled students who have a disability related requirement for the equipment.

Laptops come with Windows 10, Office 2016, Text Help Read & Write, Mind Genius and Dragon Naturally Speaking. Digital Voice Recorders come with a USB cable and built in microphone. Basic training on the equipment and software can be provided by the Disability and Dyslexia Support Team.

Non-Medical Help

Non-medical help (bands 1 and 2) is provided in-house. This support consists of the following:

- Practical Support Assistant (Band 1)
- Library Support Assistant (Band 1)
- Exam Reader (Band 1)
- Exam Scribe (Band 1)
- Workshop/Lab Assistant (Band 1)
- Proof Reader (Band 1)
- Sighted Guide (Band 1)
- Study Assistant (Band 2)
- Examination Support Worker (Band 2)
- Manual Note Taker (hand written) (Band 2)

Students who require this support should discuss their support requirements with a Disabilities Adviser. Bands 1 and 2 support are often discussed within a student's DSA Needs Assessment but this support is no longer funded by the student's funding body (Student Finance England, NHS Student Bursaries etc).

Accommodation

Accessible and adapted accommodation is available around the University residences. When you apply for accommodation, you must state if any adaptations or adjustments are required – Accommodations Services will then send you a form that you can complete, allowing you to outline your requirements. Hardship Fund (Access to Learning Fund)

Students who incur a £200 contribution fee towards the cost of a Disabled Students' Allowances (DSA) funded laptop may be eligible for hardship funding. Once the student has enrolled at University, registered with the Disability and Dyslexia Support Team and can prove they have paid the £200 contribution to the equipment supplier, they should make a full application to the Access to Learning Fund. Funding is only available to students who can show they are in hardship.

Library Support

A range of library support is available to disabled students including extended loans, item retrieval service, postal service, one to one inductions to the library, accessible access and alternative format textbooks. The available support is discussed and requested during an appointment with a Disabilities Adviser.
