



Neil Denton

Professor in Practice (Communities and Conflict Transformation) from the Relationships Projects.



Neil believes there is an energy within disagreement and conflict that can be a powerful force for positive change. He helps communities in conflict to find ways to reduce violence, increase justice, solve real life problems and strengthen human relationships.

Neil is an Independent Community Mediator, an Associate with the Relationships Project, co- founder of the After Disasters Network and a Professor in Practice at the Institute of Hazard, Risk and Resilience, Durham University. He works to find ways that place communities at the heart of our thinking and doing, and to explore and demonstrate how the principles and practices of conflict transformation can be beneficial to disaster prevention, response and recovery. He also spends time swimming and attempting to create the perfect roast potato.

Neil will speak to us about the importance of putting relationships first in design.

Cecilia Scolaro

Educator and Consultant for Responsible Design



With a background in Design and almost 20 years experience across several industries, roles and companies, Cecilia focuses on Responsible Design, to prioritise respect, social equity and sustainability in the design of businesses, products and services. She supports people, individually or in teams, integrating Responsible Design in their thinking and working.

In a world riddled with inequalities, exploitation, and the consequences of climate change, Cecilia asks what has been the role of Design and designers? Can we genuinely claim, in good faith, that Design has always operated in the best interests of humanity and the planet? Her presentation will invite us to reflect and self-assess the mindsets that underlie some of Design's most established practices. What if our daily work were enabling the very exploitation and inequality that we aim to eradicate? Cecilia will encourage us to delve deep, altering our mindsets and references to adopt practices rooted not in exploitation but in ecology, social justice, wellbeing, and systemic thinking.

Justine Aldersley-Williams

Botanical Textile Dyer Teacher & Founder of the Northern England Fibreshed



Justine Aldersey-Williams started the 'Homegrown Homespun' flax and woad growing collaboration that aimed to bring indigo linen jeans to market while helping incentivise the reintroduction of textile crops and processing facilities in the UK. As a result she's raised awareness of the regenerative potential of clothing and made history by producing the U.K.'s first homegrown pair of jeans. Justine is also Director of (soon to launch) Homegrown Colour Ltd. who are growing Organic British Indigo at scale to meet the growing demand from dye factories and brands wishing to divest from fossil fuel derived pigments.

Justine will talk to us about her project 'Woman Grows Jeans' the story of the UKs first pair of homegrown jeans and their potential to help transition the British fashion industry away from fossil fuels. Justine will share the shamanic journey that inspired her to spend 9 weeks hand spinning her homegrown flax and woad into indigo linen. In this talk, Justine will share valuable insights into the contemporary practice of regenerative traditions and chart a path forwards in communion with our botanical wisdom keepers.

Gavin Munroe

Co-Founder of Full Grown, growing trees into chairs, tables, sculptures and lamps.



Intersecting the boundaries between Nature and Art, Science and Horticulture, Manufacture and Design, Alice & Gavin Munro, and the Full Grown team join hands with our ancestors across the millennia. The Full Grown project reconsiders the Agricultural Revolution and intends to learn how to bypass the previous profligate commercial use of trees as a timber commodity (together with the attendant machinery & processing), and create each piece with a 'zen carbon sink 3d printer', a magnificent tree.

This represents a paradigm shift in the previous egregious plundering of our world's natural resources, transforming our relationship with nature, creating our everyday objects by employing the most subtle intervention with Nature.


Cornucopia




Collectively, we will explore what more-than-human ecologies of care could be, and how we can work towards these ecologies through care-ful and responsible design practice.












