RAISING ASPIRATIONS

At Northumbria we are committed to supporting aspirations and recruiting high quality students, regardless of their background.

Destination Northumbria, our supported entry scheme, offers valuable resources, guidance and a strong support network to help develop the skills and knowledge in preparation for undergraduate study. Through a range of fun and engaging activities, your young person will build friendships with fellow applicants and become part of a community long before they arrive on campus.

We also understand that personal social or socio-economic circumstances can impact education, experience and qualifications. We review all aspects of an applicant's profile and make an appropriate offer based on this information.

We use a range of flexible admissions options to support students to access study at Northumbria, such as:

Contextual Offers: Using both academic performance and personal circumstances from UCAS applications when assessing applications.

Aspirational Offers: Encouraging students to aim for the best results they can achieve by making standard offers to students who are predicted slightly below our standard requirements.

Dual Offers: Standard offers which include a reserved place on an extended degree with foundation year for applicants who do not meet their standard degree offer.

Alternative programmes: Offering alternative degrees where applicants do not meet the standard criteria for an offer.

FUNDING

Tuition Fees

Undergraduate tuition fees are set by Government in line with forecast inflation. Students should expect to pay tuition fees for every year of study.

Tuition Fee Loan

All full-time students from the UK, provided they have not studied for an undergraduate degree before, are eligible for a tuition fee loan which covers the full cost for each year of the desired course. The government pays Northumbria University directly in three instalments and the first is paid once a student enrolls on their course.

Maintenance Loans

This loan will contribute towards living costs. The money is paid into your young person's bank account at the start of each term. The maximum loan amount depends on a number of factors, including:

- **Whether the student is living at home.**
- **Studying in or out of London.**
- **Your household income.**

Scholarships, Grants and Bursaries

Scholarships, grants, and bursaries are financial awards that are designed to help to support students financially through their studies. They can be awarded for many different reasons and this is often dependent on which organisation that is awarding the scholarship. Different organisations will have different application processes and requirements to receive the scholarship.

Northumbria University is committed to supporting students by offering a number of packages. Undergraduate scholarships will be available for students starting their first year in September 2027. It's not just universities that offer money to help with the costs of studying. Other organisations offer funding too – including charities, trusts and even companies. In this case, funding might be called a grant or sponsorship, as well as bursary or scholarship.

There is extra government funding available for those in special circumstances such as the Disabled Students' Allowance and the Childcare Grant. For further information about financial support at university please visit **northumbria.ac.uk/financialsupport**

APPLYING FOR STUDENT FINANCE

If you and your young person want to apply for financial support for the tuition fee and living costs, we recommend visiting the Student Finance England (SFE) website for more information at **www.gov.uk/apply-online-for-student-finance**. This also includes links to Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland student funding.

After your application has been processed, SFE will send a Student Finance Entitlement letter with your Customer Reference Number (CRN), which you should quote whenever you contact them. Following enrolment at university, Student Loans Company will pay the tuition fee loan direct to the university. The maintenance loan will go straight to your child's chosen bank account in specified instalments.

This simple 8 Step Guide for navigating Student Finance will help you through the process. These steps are very similar for students who live in Northern Ireland, Scotland, or Wales, however we advise checking the individual agency websites for more detailed information.

8 STEP GUIDE TO A STUDENT FINANCE APPLICATION

1. Check if your young person is eligible
 2. Find out how much loan they could get
 3. Prepare the application on the SFE website
 4. Apply
 5. Update your circumstances if things change
 6. Make sure the student can be paid
 7. Check what to do while they are a student
 8. Repay from the April after graduation

TOP TIP!

It's wise to apply for Student Finance as soon as possible after submitting an application to study. Updates to the course and university can be made if needed.

MONEY MATTERS

Cost of Living

Ranked among the top five most affordable cities in the UK (QS Best Student Cities 2026), Newcastle is an excellent choice for university students, offering a significantly lower cost of living than many other parts of the UK. With its vibrant culture, thriving student community, and budget-friendly lifestyle, Newcastle offers a unique blend of quality education and great value for money.

Students can access a range of resources to help them with money management from Northumbria's Student Money and Resources Hub. Students can also access the financial education platform Blackbullion to help with budgeting and planning finances. UK students can also apply to the Student Money and Support Funds, which are four funds aimed at supporting costs associated with accommodation and living costs, travel, childcare and course costs. Students can also receive one to one support on all funding and financial aspects of study from a team of advisers.

Northumbria Students' Union also offer the following support to students:

- **Food Pantry - a food bank service for short-term support.**
- **Laptop loan scheme - offering students a short-term loan of a laptop if needed.**
- **Free hot water and microwaves - available to prepare food while on campus.**
- **Free sanitary products.**



APPLYING FOR ACCOMMODATION

At Northumbria, we understand that where your young person lives is a big aspect of their student experience. That's why we make sure they shape their experience from start to finish.

Booking Accommodation takes just 5 easy steps

1. Make Northumbria University your FIRM choice on UCAS Hub.

2. Receive your student portal login details via email, log in and go to the Accommodation section to start your application.

Top Tip: Make sure you register with your personal email address and not one associated to a school/college.

3. Choose your exact room.

4. Sign your contract.

Top Tip: Make sure you read your contract carefully as it is a legally binding contract. If you don't understand anything, get in touch, we will be happy to run through it with you.

5. Make an advance rent payment.

You will need to make an advance rent payment to complete the booking. The amount depends on the building you have selected, but is normally £250. This amount is part of the total rent payment and is deducted from the final rent instalment*.

*This applies to properties managed by Student Living by Sodexo.

SUPPORT FOR STUDENTS

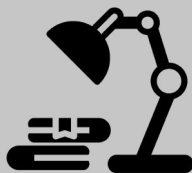
TOP TIPS FOR PARENTS

Applying for University



- Make sure your young person adds Northumbria University to their contacts to ensure emails don't disappear into their junk inbox.
- If your child may want you to speak on their behalf, about their application, make sure they give this permission verbally or via email.

Preparing for Exams



- Revision and exam timetables help plan time and prepare for the exam season.
- Taking breaks during revision sessions is important.
- Encourage your young person to sleep well, eat a well-balanced diet and keep hydrated.

Results Day



- Encourage having an early night before results day and to eat breakfast in the morning. It could be a long day for them.
- Reassure and support them regardless of the outcome. There are plenty of opportunities through Clearing.
- Be ready and understand the UCAS Clearing process. You can find out more at northumbria.ac.uk/clearing
- Ensure your young person knows their Personal ID number and login details for UCAS and the Student Finance Company.

Moving checklist

- ☐ Pots and pans – check what the accommodation provides first.
- ☐ Bedding – what size bedding is needed for their new accommodation?
- ☐ Some favourite items to help make their room feel like a home from home.
- ☐ Make sure your young person registers with a doctor near their new home.
- ☐ TV license - ensure this is purchased if needed.

A-Z OF UNIVERSITY

ACCREDITATION - a professional body or organisation has recognised and endorsed a particular course, demonstrating its quality and relevance.

APPLICANT PORTAL - after applying to Northumbria we will send an email with login details for our applicant portal. Here they can track their application and upload any necessary documents.

CAMPUS - the area containing the university's main facilities, including student accommodation, teaching buildings, and leisure areas.

CLEARING - this period, from July, allows universities to offer places on undergraduate courses outside of the standard application process. Places may be limited and entry requirements may differ to standard entry requirements.

CONDITIONAL OFFER - an offer made by the university on the basis that the applicant still needs to meet the requirements - usually exam results.

CONTEXTUAL OFFER - a reduced UCAS tariff point offer which is less than our standard entry criteria. This may be offered based on information provided in the application.

DESTINATION NORTHUMBRIA - this is a programme designed to prepare and support with the transition to studying at university.

EXTENDED DEGREE - a four or five year study route designed for students who have not achieved the entry requirements for their chosen course. Following successful completion of the foundation year, the student can progress onto the first year of their degree.

FIRM CHOICE - this is your young person's first-choice university - as long as they meet the conditions of their offer, they'll get a place on their course.

INSURANCE CHOICE - this is your young person's back-up option if they don't meet the conditions for their first choice. It makes sense to pick somewhere with lower entry requirements just in case they don't get their expected grades.

MAINTENANCE LOAN - this is a loan that is paid directly to students and helps to cover living expenses while studying.

NOMINATED CONTACT - an applicant can choose a nominated contact (this may be you) who can speak to the university about their application. This must be confirmed either verbally or in writing.

NU EXPERIENCE DAY - our events for offer-holders to experience life on their course at Northumbria.

OPEN DAY - our events to see the facilities at Northumbria and find out more about our courses before applying.
PERSONAL STATEMENT - This part of the application is your young person's chance to tell universities and colleges why they'd like to study with them, showing their passion for the subject, and demonstrating skills and experience.
PLACEMENT - an opportunity to spend time working in a relevant field to gain industry experience.
PORTFOLIO - some courses may require a portfolio in the application process as a way to provide evidence of an applicant's work, demonstrate creativity and share interests and inspirations.
POSTGRADUATE DEGREE - this is a higher-level course such as a Master's degree or PhD often studied after an undergraduate degree (typically a Bachelors).
REFERENCE - This part of the application is a piece of text ideally written by someone who can comment on your young person's academic ability.
SAFEZONE APP - this app is available at Northumbria and provides direct contact between the user and the university Security Team.
STUDY ABROAD - the opportunity to study at a partner university in another country.
TUITION FEE LOAN - this loan covers the cost of tuition fees charged by universities and is paid directly to the university.
UCAS TARIFF POINTS - UCAS allocate points to different grades for post-16 qualifications (A-Levels, BTECs etc), and some universities, including Northumbria, base their undergraduate entry requirements on these points.
UCAS HUB - this is where applications can be started, submitted and tracked.
UNCONDITIONAL OFFER - an offer given by a university based on the information in an application, although there might still be a few things to arrange.
UNDERGRADUATE DEGREE - refers to a Bachelors degree and is usually the first degree after school or college.
