Introduction

During the 2022-23 academic year, the North East Uni Connect Programme has continued to support young people and their key influencers in the North East. We have achieved this through our programme of targeted outreach interventions in schools, our structured support for students in the region's further education (FE) colleges, our regional signposting and support for teachers and advisers and our strategic outreach collaborations.

FutureMe, our targeted programme of activity, has engaged with 10,944 target learners across 123 schools and colleges, providing information, advice and guidance on the range of higher education (HE) routes and pathways in the region. This activity ensures that young people in the North East have the skills and knowledge they need to overcome barriers to progression.

Through measuring the impact of our FutureMe activity, we can demonstrate that not only has overall progression in the region gone up, but that higher levels of participation in our programme significantly increases the likelihood that a student will progress to higher education.

In addition, this year through our strategic engagement with the North East Raising Aspiration Partnership (NERAP), Outreach North East were able to expand their support for teachers and advisers across the North East to include the Higher Education Advisers and Teachers (HEAT) Conference, which brought together professionals from across the region.

We look forward to continuing to work with and support our regions schools, colleges, universities, partners and most importantly students, in 2023-24.

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Uni Connect in the North East

In 2021-22 the higher education progression rate increased in the North East region by **2.1%** on the previous year.

Our evaluation demonstrates that:

The NEUCP works with students in all 15 colleges across the North East of England. In this region, Further Education plays a really important role in young people's progression routes to Higher Education, and this is particularly true for young people from underrepresented groups.

Throughout the 2022-23 academic year, all 15 colleges delivered FutureMe activity across a range of areas, underpinned by our Regional Progression Framework, including UCAS support, Subject Insights and Careers, as well as giving students the chance to interact with key local employers.





Our Schools Programme

During the 2022-23 academic year, students in Years 10-13 in schools across the region continued to benefit from a range of FutureMe events and activities designed to support them in thinking about the range of routes and pathways available to them in education, and develop the skills needed to make successful applications. Activities included:

•Undergraduate Mentoring
•Higher Education Outreach Workshops
•Campus Visits

Whilst in person events continue to be the most popular option with schools and students, FutureMe sessions continue to be available in alternative formats which allowed flexibility for schools and students preferring to engage with virtual delivery formats such as webinars and pre-recorded material/resources.

New for this academic year were the 'Developing FutureMe@' events. These skills-based experience days were hosted at partner universities across the region and provided students in Years 10–13 the opportunity to learn more study skills and techniques, all while exploring a higher education campus and considering what their future in higher education could look like. One event, held at Durham University, saw students attend with their parents so that both audiences benefitted from the information delivered on the day.

Students in Year 10 continued to receive support through our mentoring programme, which linked them with undergraduate students from each of the five universities in the region and explored a range of topics related to higher education and future careers. The programme concluded with a visit to one of our partner institutions to celebrate the achievements of the students and allow them to experience some of the topics covered through the programme.

Outreach North East

Outreach North East provides teachers and advisers across the region with the information, resources and CPD they need to best support their students with making decisions about higher education and progression.

In the 2022-23 academic year, Outreach North East delivered CPD sessions on a range of subjects including Degree Apprenticeships, Student Finance, and supporting Care Experienced students. These sessions were delivered in collaboration with: ASK Apprenticeships; Health Education England; UCAS; Money & Pensions Service; Student Finance England; National Network for the Education of Care Leavers and the North East Raising Aspiration Partnership.

Outreach North East have been successfully working with UCAS since 2020-21 to provide key updates and support at relevant points in the year. 2022-23 delivery of UCAS CPD included sessions on: personal statements, preparing for the January deadline, and confirmation and clearing, among others.

Supporting Teachers and Advisers

The Higher Education Advisers and Teachers (HEAT) Conference took place on the 1st December 2022. Delivered by Outreach North East and the North East Raising Aspiration Partnership (NERAP), the conference was attended by 100 teachers, advisers and HE professionals from across the North East who came together to discuss key issues related to HE progression and fair access regional challenges.

The conference included:

- A series of keynotes which provided both national and regional data
- Policy insights around regional context
- Information on technical qualifications and how to encourage students to access these pathways
- Practical examples to support teachers and advisers in strategically planning HE Outreach
- Tools for teacher and advisers to build an HE Outreach framework within their school or college.

The conference also featured a series of practical workshops to give the delegates the chance to focus in on key areas and to give them tools that they could implement in their own classroom. The workshops covered topics such as HE applications; technical qualifications; student finance; supported entry routes.
