18th and 19th September 2025

Abstract Submission Guidelines

The overall theme of this inaugural conference is '*Celebrating Children and Young Peoples Nursing- Our Present, Our Future*'. The **sub-themes** for the conference **include**:

Inclusion:

- Listening to, involving, and working with children, young people, and families; shaping and realising change in healthcare.
- Creating healthier, equitable and inclusive environments through dynamic workforce and health system delivery for children, young people and families.

Innovation:

- Enhancements to education for the future of children and young people's nursing.
- Workforce development, design and practice innovation: creating communities of practice, new ways of working to lead better care for children, young people and families.

Intervention:

- Investing in and founding advances within clinical practice for children and young people's healthcare.
- Supporting the safety and wellbeing of children, young people and those who care for them.

Impact:

- Research for improving health and tackling inequalities for children, young people and families.
- Leading and amplifying the value of children and young people's nursing in the hospital, home, and community setting.

Instructions for submission:

1. Abstracts must be submitted to the conference abstract online **portal**, selecting which **sub-theme** you feel your work best represents.
2. An abstract can be submitted in the following presentation types:
 - a. Oral Presentation: A 15-minute presentation of your work -grouped by theme.
 - b. Poster Presentation: A visual presentation of your work that will be displayed during the poster sessions.
 - c. The abstract text must be no more than 500 words (not including title and author's information) and should highlight the main points the presenter(s) wish to share. If your abstract exceeds this length, it will not be saved.
 - d. The abstract submission format should adopt the following **sub-headings**, *Background/Introduction, Design/Methods, Results/Findings, Discussion, Conclusion/Recommendation(s)*
3. **Mandatory requirements for abstracts:**
 - a. Abstracts must be submitted in English. No other language will be accepted and will be removed after the abstract submission window closes.
 - b. Abstracts must be original and have not been presented elsewhere.
 - c. There is a limit of two (2) abstracts per the first submitting author however you can be a co-author on an unlimited number of other abstracts.
4. Only fully completed presenter profiles and abstract submissions **marked as final version** will be reviewed.
5. Those whose abstracts are accepted must register at least **one author** to present at the conference by the **early bird deadline**. Accepted abstracts will be removed from the programme after this date if registration and fee payment have not been received.



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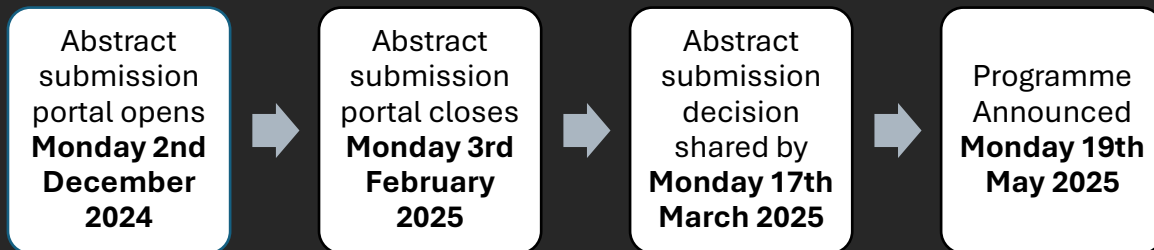
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6. All decisions on abstract acceptance are final. The organising committee reserve the right to alter the category selected for an abstract submission.
