Taken from this year's Reveal show, existing landmark buildings and empty plots across the city have been reimagined, with final designs augmented into the Virtual NewcastleGateshead model to provide an immersive experience. Virtual NewcastleGateshead is a digital reconstruction of Newcastle and Gateshead, developed in partnership with both local councils. It is used as part of the planning process to consider new design proposals, as well as a wide range of academic and industry research projects.

The interactive element of the exhibit will be supported though a range of physical activities (e.g. cooking for all ages, measuring body fat, blood pressure etc.), accompanied by animation and nutrition themed adventure stories. There will be healthy cooking demonstrations and taster sessions from a number of chefs and nutritionists from Chartwells and bite size motivation and health talks.

Justin is interested in using digital tools/technologies, not for the accurate reproductive capabilities for which they are so often put to work in design contexts, but for their transformative role; emphasizing the intrinsic role that engagement with tools, digital or otherwise, play in the creative act of making.



The Gallery houses 47 items from the Woon Foundation's Collection to support research and public exhibition in the North East of England. Each item has been selected for its contribution not only to the understanding and application of craft and making but also the relationship of Buddhist Art to culture and religious belief, practice, and devotion, particularly the representation of the divine through physical form and materiality. In selecting items from the Woon Foundation Collection, we have specifically chosen depictions of the Buddha from different cultures and periods in order to bring a fresh perspective on the interpretation of Asian and Buddhist Art. The collection will be used as an education and research resource and will support the City's Cultural Strategy.

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Frederick Douglass Exhibition	University Gallery	9th July- 9 Sept 10am - 6pm	Work by St Pauls Church of England Primary School - representations of Frederick Douglass. On February 26, 2018, Linda Wright, the Lord Mayor of Newcastle upon Tyne, unveiled a plaque at 5, Summerhill Grove. The plaque commemorated the visits to the city of Frederick Douglass, the most famous African American abolitionist of the mid-19th Century and a tireless campaigner for social justice on both sides of the Atlantic. The plaque also recognised that Douglass was just one of many fugitive slaves who came to Newcastle in the 19th Century, many of whom also stayed at 5, Summerhill Grove with the Richardson family Henry, his wife Anna and sister Ellen. The Richardsons were Quaker activists at the heart of a vibrant abolitionist movement on Tyneside that reflected strong radical and progressive political traditions in the area.
