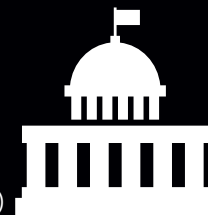

AWARD TITLE – Bachelors (e.g. BA, BS)

DURATION – 4 years

GENERAL EDUCATION – Common

MAJOR – Declared during study

HONORS TRACK – Restricted

ADMISSIONS PHILOSOPHY – Suitable for institution, holistic

APPLICATION – Direct to institution or Common Application, for example

CHANGING MAJOR – Common

TRANSFERRING INSTITUTION – Common

TUTOR – Additional help with a class subject

UK

AWARD TITLE – Bachelors (e.g. BA, BSc, BEng)

DURATION – 3 years (England, Northern Ireland and Wales), 4 years (Scotland)

GENERAL EDUCATION – No general education requirements

MAJOR – Declared at application

HONORS TRACK – All students

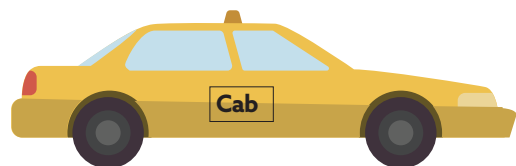
ADMISSIONS PHILOSOPHY – Suitable for major, academic

APPLICATION – Universities and Colleges Admissions Service (UCAS). Some accept Common or Direct Application

CHANGING MAJOR – Rare. Case by case and must happen early within the first semester

TRANSFERRING INSTITUTION – Rare. Typically only happens for students studying externally accredited professional programs such as law

TUTOR – Member of academic staff; offers academic and pastoral support



KEY DATES FOR YOUR APPLICATION

1 SEPTEMBER APPLICATIONS OPEN

Apply through UCAS. Institutions may also consider direct or Common App



15 JANUARY RECOMMENDED DEADLINE FOR EQUAL CONSIDERATION

Applying before 15th January is recommended. Some universities will consider applications after this date but it is not guaranteed

30 JUNE DEADLINE FOR APPLICATIONS VIA UCAS

Typically the latest advertised date for submission of applications via UCAS

SEPTEMBER/OCTOBER UNIVERSITY SEMESTER ONE STARTS

Start dates vary across institutions, typically two semesters:

Autumn term: September – December
Spring term: January – April

MARCH – JUNE STUDENT RESEARCH

British Council – find your major
Unistats – compare your major
The Student Room – discuss your major



15 OCTOBER SPECIALIST MAJORS AND OXBRIDGE DEADLINE

This includes Medicine, Veterinary Science, Dentistry or applying to Oxford/Cambridge

UK ADMISSIONS

APPLICANTS ARE TYPICALLY ASSESSED IN THE FOLLOWING AREAS:

Academic proficiency

- Demonstrated through High School Diploma and standardised testing or equivalent awards such as Associate Degrees

Personal statement and reference

- 4000 characters describing interest in major, career plans, achievements in and out of classroom, what makes you unique!

Additional requirement

- Depending on institution and major, interviews, portfolio or additional testing may be required

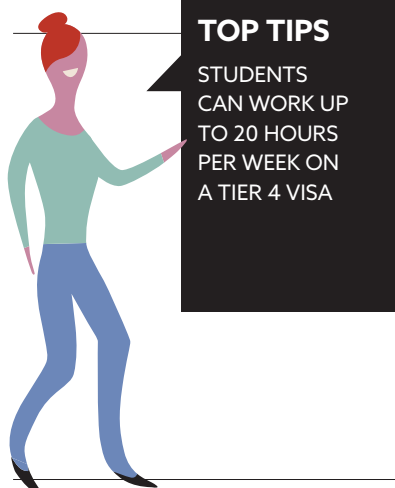

WE WELCOME APPLICANTS FROM HIGH SCHOOLS AND TRANSFERS FROM COMMUNITY COLLEGES/ UNIVERSITY.

Transfer Students:

Case by case and dependent on Major

High School students:

High School Diploma (unweighted and cumulative) GPA of 3.0/4.0 **plus one of the following:**

- SAT 1240 (R&W 630+ and Math 610+)
- ACT 26+
- AP's Grade 3 or above in minimum of two tests
- SAT Subject Tests 550+ in minimum of two test (preferably three tests)

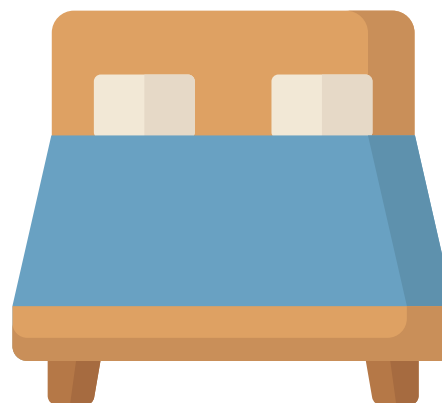
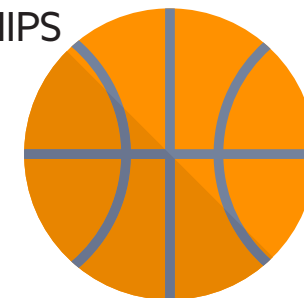
US FINANCIAL AID

- Get used to the accent! The people and residents are so friendly!

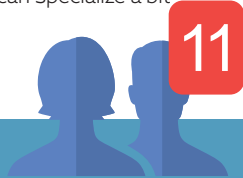
NATALIA ESTRADA

NATALIA'S TOP TIPS:

- Apply early and be prepared to see words you don't exactly understand and look them up, don't try and guess what they mean!
- When it comes time to pick a primary choice in UCAS it's binding, so make sure it is for sure the school you want to go to.
- Do a ton of research into the city because if you don't feel it is the right match it's better to find out before you commit to it
- Communicate with your parents because it's just as much if not more scary for them for you to apply abroad, but don't let them talk you out of coming either!

OUR AMERICAN ALUMNI'S VIEW

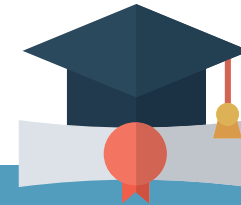

In America, my experience is that there was no emphasis on critical thinking. I learned to think more critically here at Northumbria and not to rely on one source for information. This has really helped me when I started a business after graduation with my course mate. We started working on an idea together but I never thought I would be able to start a business in the UK because of my Visa.

I was amazed to find out Northumbria has a free start-up support service that is ranked no. 1 in the UK*. The University helped me apply for my graduate entrepreneur visa, gave us free office space and continue to support us in our business. Knowing I have access to careers support even after graduation and being a part of the alumni network is invaluable.

MARAL'S TOP TIPS:
