Why have I been invited to take part? We are looking for participants to take part in order to explore experiences, attitudes and perceptions of body, tissue and data donation.

How much time will this take?

- The activities will take around one to two hours to complete but can be worked on across a longer period of time in smaller sections.
- There will also be an online workshop which will take place around two weeks after you have received your post pack for one hour.

What will I get out of taking part?

- You will be able to learn more about body, tissue and data donation and reflect on what that means for you and your family
- You will be able to have an impact on research that explores public attitudes to body, tissue and data donation.
- Your responses will directly influence the development of a new public art work that will tour across the UK this autumn.

What happens to my data?

Your personal data will be stored securely on the Northumbria University server and will never be shared with anyone outside the core project team. It will be deleted when the project is completed. Any data that you share with the project team about your responses to the post kits will only be used if you have signed a consent form stating this is your wish.

COVID-19 precautions

The kits will be constructed and put into envelopes at least 24 hours before posting.
