

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS: MSc GLOBAL SUSTAINABLE BUSINESS MANAGEMENT

Global Sustainable Business Management is a joint master's programme run in partnership between Northumbria University (NU) and Amsterdam University of Applied Sciences (AUAS). Information shared in this document is accurate at the time of sharing (10/10/2022).

GENERAL

What is a joint master's?

- A *joint master's* is a programme that is developed and taught by two universities. In the end you, the student attains a degree from both institutions.

How many credits is the programme?

- Global Sustainable Business Management equates to 90 European Credits/180 UK Credits, as an 18-month programme.

When does the programme start?

- The academic year for Global Sustainable Business Management starts in September. There are currently no other intakes (i.e., January, May etc.) for this programme.

APPLYING FOR GLOBAL SUSTAINABLE BUSINESS MANAGEMENT

How do I apply for the programme?

- Applications for a programme at a Dutch university are submitted via Studielink, a Dutch national educational administration portal. Upon completion of an application for Global Sustainable Business Management via Studielink, the portal will send your application to AUAS. You can find a step-by-step of the full *admission process here*.

What is Studielink?

Studielink is a Dutch national portal in which you register your intent to apply for a programme at a Dutch university (i.e., Global Sustainable Business Management MSc at AUAS). Following submission, your application will be sent to the university you have applied for.

What is SIS?

 SIS is the Student Information System used by AUAS after you have registered via Studielink and have applied for Global Sustainable Business Management at AUAS. Within a week of applying, you should receive an AUAS ID to access this system, allowing you to review the status of your application and enrolment.





WHAT IS THE APPLICATION DEADLINE FOR NON-EU STUDENTS?

^{*}If you are graduating this academic year then you need to submit a signed copy of your most recent transcript of records and a graduation statement signed by your home university. As soon as you receive your diploma, you need to submit a certified copy of it and notify the Central Student Administration of AUAS. The deadline for uploading your diploma for non-EU students is 01 July.

Payment of tuition fees	by 01 August!

^{*}EU applicants are strongly advised to submit their documents/credentials no later than the beginning of August in order to have their application evaluated in time to start in September. Evaluation can take up to 6 weeks.


I ALREADY HAVE A RESIDENCE PERMIT FOR STUDY PURPOSES AND WANT TO TRANSFER TO AUAS?

^{**}The immigration process deadlines are subject to change. They will be confirmed in April 2023.





What are the entry requirements for this programme?

- For Global Sustainable Business Management, the standard entry requirements will depend on where in the world you are domiciled. A full outline of requirements can be found *here*.

Am I admissible for the programme?

- The best way to find out if you are admissible is to apply for the programme via Studielink. Then you need to submit <u>the required documents</u> in order for AUAS to process your application. You will receive an email from AUAS stating whether you are admissible or not.

Will I need to complete an interview?

 Prospective students with an undergraduate degree not in Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics (STEM), Business or Economics are welcome to apply for Global Sustainable Business Management, but your admission process will include a mandatory interview to assess your suitability for the programme.

SUBMITTING YOUR DOCUMENTS/CREDENTIALS

• Where and when do I need to submit the required documents?

- After you register in Studielink, you will receive an email from the AUAS Central Student Administration within 3 days to setup your AUAS account. Following this you will receive a link to submit your documents via <u>topdesk</u> or <u>SIS</u>.

What if I do not have my official diploma yet?

- If you are still studying your bachelor's degree, you will be required to upload your most recent transcript of records and your statement of graduation by 01 June. If you are a non-EU student, you will be required to upload your official diploma by 01 July.

After I have submitted the required academic documents, how long does the evaluation of my application take? When will I receive a reply?


- It takes 2 – 6 weeks for AUAS to evaluate your academic documents. If you submit your academic documents before the deadline, then we guarantee that your application will be taken into consideration. You will receive an update about the status of your application as soon as possible. You can also check the status of your application yourself via the Student Information System

IMMIGRATION AND PROOF OF FINANCIAL MEANS

What is the immigration process?

 AUAS has an immigration department that will help you step-by-step during the immigration process. The AUAS immigration department will contact you in May and provide more information about the process and the actions you need to take including the deadlines. The AUAS immigration department will apply for a residence permit on your behalf. More general information can be found here.





What is proof of financial means?

- As part of the immigration process, you need to submit a 'proof of financial means'. The Dutch Immigration and Naturalisation Service (IND) requires that you have sufficient financial means to cover your stay in the Netherlands. Students who come to AUAS need to show that they have sufficient financial resources. Please see *here* for more information.

• Will a government loan be accepted as proof of financial means?

- Government funded student loans of any kind are not accepted as proof of financial means.

TUITION FEE COSTS AND PAYING YOUR FEES

What are the tuition fees?

- The tuition fees for Global Sustainable Business Management will depend on whether you are an EU or International student, and whether you are a current student/Alumni of AUAS or Northumbria. A full breakdown of fees for all customer groups can be found *here*.

How and when do EU applicants pay the tuition fees?

- You can pay the tuition fee in Studielink. The payment link will be available in May. It is possible to pay in instalments. The deadline is 31 August. More information can be found *here*.

How and when do non-EU applicants pay the tuition fees?

You will receive instructions to prepare your immigration file and to pay the tuition fee and proof of financial means directly to the AUAS before 22 June. AUAS immigration affairs will send you the procedure e-mail and the AUAS bank account details in May. Unfortunately, we cannot accept payments in instalments. ACCOMMODATION AND LIVING IN AMSTERDAM

Can I work will studying for this programme?

Global Sustainable Business Management is a full-time programme and is therefore not possible
to work full-time alongside studying. You may be able to work part-time. However, if you are a
non-EU student, you will need to check the terms and conditions of your visa. Please see more
