How your bachelors degree is classified

This is a simplified explanation – for more detail see our regulations



Degree Classification: Method

The calculation for the classification Degree (Hons) Programmes is based on:

• the average mark of Levels 6 and 5 (weighted 60%:40%).

Degree Classification: Important Notes

- All level 5 and level 6 results are considered, whether you pass your modules/credits outright or whether you pass after a resit or are compensated. **
- You MUST complete ALL credits.
- Also:
 - <u>all</u> grades for <u>all</u> modules will be listed on your transcripts
 - In borderline cases <u>all</u> grades will be considered to make a final classification



^{**}Compensation is when you fail a module but, because you have passed other modules this 'compensates' for the fail and you don't have to do a resit. Subject to ARTA regulations

Degree Classification: "Borderline" Cases

- You have to get 70%+ overall for a 1st class; 60%+ overall for a 2:1; 50%+ for a 2:2; 40%+ for a 3rd
- We look at anyone who is borderline i.e. if your overall mark (based on the method described above) is within 2% of a class of degree class.
- You will be awarded the Higher classification :
 - if the <u>majority of your marks at level 6</u> lie on or above the boundary.



Degree Classification: Worked Example

Your Level 4, 5 and 6 modules are graded as follows:

	Module 1 (20 credits)	Module 2 (20 credits)	Module 3 (20 credits)	Module 4 (20 credits)	Module 5 (20 credits)	Module 6 (20 credits)
Level 4	40%	40%	40%	40%	40%	40%
Level 5	40%	50%	50%	50%	50%	50%
Level 6	40%	70%	70%	70%	70%*	

- Level 4 Modules are not included in the classification calculation.
- Classification is based on:
 - Levels 6 and 5 (weighted 60%:40% = **58%**)
- Classification outcome: Second Class Upper Division (2:1)
 - 58% falls within the borderline range (within 2% of the higher class)
 - The majority of level 6 credit is either on or above the higher class boundary which qualifies for higher classification.
